About Valencia, Spain

Valencia is the capital of the autonomous community of Valencia and the third largest city in Spain after Madrid and Barcelona, with around 800,000 inhabitants in the administrative centre. Valencia is Spain's third largest metropolitan area, with a population ranging from 1.7 to 2.5 million. The city has global city status.

The Port of Valencia is the 5th busiest container port in Europe and busiest container port on the Mediterranean Sea. Research into dementia in Spain comes under the neurodegenerative diseases strand of the national plan on neuroscience managed by the National Centre for Research into Neurological Disease (CIEN11), which comes under the control of the Ministry of Science and Innovation.

In 2008, the Spanish Ministry of Health and the non-profit Queen Sofia Foundation¹² jointly established an Alzheimer's disease research centre as part of the Alzheimer's project.

In 2009, CIEN and the Institute of Health Carlos III¹³ (Spain's public health research institute) joined forces with the Queen Sofia Foundation to create a research unit dedicated to Alzheimer's disease and related conditions¹⁴. In addition, the Queen Sofia Foundation and the Pasqual Maragall Foundation for Research on Alzheimer's disease¹⁵ have launched a joint initiative to make 2011 the "year of Alzheimer's research"¹⁶ in order to raise (private) funds, exchange ideas, and contribute towards the European initiative on Alzheimer's disease.
