

EAN Education Committee Chair

The EAN Education Committee (EC) develops recommendations and monitors activities related to educational issues. The Chair of this committee is appointed by the EAN Board (not elected, article 21 EAN Byelaws) and has a full seat within the EAN Board. According to the educational mission of EAN, the aim is to define the standard skills of a European neurologist and to provide as much education to European neurologists as needed. A main focus of the EC are the [EAN fellowships](#) and the [mentorship programme](#), and development of new educational activities as well as improvement and quality control of existing activities. Job description:

For all EAN education committees, a track record in neurology education or assessment is particularly desirable. The final decision and appointment of committee chairs and members is with the EAN Board.

Education Committee chair:

- must be (or become) EAN Full Individual member (<https://www.ean.org/Members.2669.0.html>)
- has a seat in the EAN Board
- must attend the EAN annual congress (Thursday – Tuesday)
- needs around 1h per day for EAN related mails and projects (regular email contact is expected (with Board and department head from EAN office)
- must attend 4-5 zoom meetings, 2 in-person Education committee meetings
- must attend 8 Board zoom meetings, 2 in-person Board meetings
- be in good contact with the other Education sub-committee chairs (Teaching course, eLearning, Joint EAN/UEMS Education board)
- when being past Education committee chair, will become co-chair of the JEB
- financial aid: expenses for any meetings outside the congress are fully met, but the position is otherwise entirely voluntary
- position: chairpersons and members of our standing committees kindly serve EAN for a 2-year term, and can prolong this term by another 2 years.
