

Call for Applications: eanCampus Deputy Editor-in-Chief

March, 2026

The European Academy of Neurology is looking for a Deputy Editor-in-Chief for the [eanCampus](#) (e-Learning platform from EAN).

The e-Learning Deputy Editor-in-Chief will be in charge of, inter alia, the incorporation of existing e-Learning items, the development and renewal of e-Learning content. Candidates must be EAN Members with an established international reputation as both clinicians and educators and must have a current academic appointment in a neurology-related field. We ask for substantial experience in medical education gained either by having a degree in medical education and/or having experience in e-Learning.

Benefits for such a position besides personal growth and implied possibilities are:

- Shaping the future of neurology through influence on eanCampus content
- Active participation within EAN and an international team
- International visibility
- EAN congress package (free registration, travel, accommodation up to 4 days) and annual honorarium

Deputy Editor-in-Chief, eanCampus platform

The Deputy Editor-in-Chief should support the Editor-in-Chief (EiC) in order to develop, communicate, and constantly adapt the publication strategy of the eanCampus within the limits set by the mission of the platform. The Deputy Editor-in-Chief is expected to work towards the EAN strategy, and to help develop the continuous strategy for the eanCampus together with the EAN Board and the e-Learning Editorial Board.

The Deputy Editor-in-Chief will be part of the Editorial Board, together with the Editor-in-Chief, a team of Associate Editors and Observing Editors for an initial period of 2.5 calendar years (July 2026-December 2028). The Deputy Editor-in-Chief may be re-appointed for one (1) additional term of 3 years.

eanCampus:

EAN is the sole and exclusive owner of the eanCampus platform. The main aim of the platform is the support of life-long learning and of achieving excellence in neurology. This digital educational space is directed towards toward medical students, residents in neurology, early career neurologists, experienced neurologists and neurological scientists in academic positions as well as in private practice. Based on the European Training Requirements in Neurology (ETRN), the platform covers general neurological concepts as well as more specified areas of the field.

EAN is striving to produce and endorse quality content that is constantly reviewed, evaluated and updated to offer the best possible learning environment for the neurological community. EAN is responsible for establishing an editorial policy, defining the aims and scope of the platform and supervising the platform's Editor-in-Chief to implement the editorial policies of EAN.

Expected experience and background:

- Established (international) reputation as both a clinician and educator
- Substantial experience in medical education gained either by having a degree in medical education and/or having experience in e-Learning
- Current academic appointment in a neurology-related field
- Demonstrable experience in neurology as a broad discipline
- Leading author on influential publications and have the ability to produce and evaluate educational material
- Capable to addressing sensitive matters diplomatically and considerately
- Be an EAN Member with knowledge about EAN

Skills:

- Excellent oral and written communication skills in English
- Ability to judge the educational validity, importance, and status of online learning material
- Understanding of and appreciation for digital publication
- Passion and commitment for the e-Learning platform and its future growth
- Openness to new ideas (eg. new subject areas for content, new formats)
- Cooperative, team-oriented, and able to take a practical, hands-on approach
- Good delegation and management skills, especially the ability to prioritize work for self and others
- Interested in innovative educational approaches and have an understanding of new technologies

Responsibilities will lay in various areas:

1) Strategic & Editorial Team Management

- To work closely with the e-Learning EiC and the EAN Education Committee to monitor and lead the strategic development of the eanCampus
- To support the work of the EiC and provide leadership to staff members

- To suggest and select Associate Editors together with the EiC for an agreed term and to ensure that the Editorial Board's composition is international and broad in scope
- To communicate regularly with the e-Learning EiC and the Associate Editors concerning the development of the eanCampus, educational strategy, submissions and promotion
- To develop and nurture corporate sales opportunities for the eanCampus in conjunction with the EAN industrial liaison manager
- To attend monthly Editorial Board meetings online, 1x in person at the EAN Congress, 1x in person at the Head Office in Vienna
- To dedicate approximately 15-20 hours per month to the review of the eanCampus or eanCampus content (can vary depending on projects throughout the year)

2) Editorial Content Management

- To meet deadlines consistently, in order to support continuous workflow
- To commission top quality educational content and develop and maintain other forms of appropriate content
- To support the peer review of content by appropriately qualified and experienced persons in a timely manner
- To create a minimum of 2 content pieces for the eanCampus per calendar year
- To support communication with authors, to accept or reject e-Learning material or to request revision
- To assist authors - where appropriate - in making their amendments to provisionally accepted content
- To maintain the eanCampus's publishing standards
- To act as a resource and decision-maker to resolve issues with the content that cannot be resolved at other levels
- To work with the Head Office and IT company to implement new features, content, and more

3) Marketing/Promotion of the eanCampus

- To be the ambassador for the eanCampus both nationally and internationally
- To promote the eanCampus platform actively when undertaking any professional activity
- In coordination with the e-Learning Editorial Board determine appropriate use of the eanCampus's name or contents for secondary markets (e.g., sponsoring of conferences held by others, unusual copyright release requests not normally handled by staff or publisher)

The Board of the European Academy of Neurology (EAN) herewith invites applications for the position of Deputy Editor-in-Chief which foresees a term of 3 years with the option of one (1) renewal. The new Deputy Editor-in-Chief of the eanCampus will assume their responsibility as of July 2026.
